nly one high school was in existence in the area now called South-Western City School District in 1954, and six boards of education governed individual school districts to serve the area.

Population was growing rapidly then, and schools were sorely pressed to meet the needs.

Only the Franklin Local District had a financial base adequate to support the growing demands. That situation came about because of the location of large industrial operations within that school district in the years just prior to 1956.

A committee of citizens representing the six districts was formed, and meetings were held with members of the various boards of education, and with county and state officials.


On January 1, 1956, the South-Western Local School District was formed. It was a consolidation of five local and one exempted village school system. These were: the Grove City-Jackson Exempted Village District, the Franklin Township Local District, the Prairie Township Local District, the Pleasant Township Local District, the Urbancrest Village District, and the Georgesville Local District.

As the area became more heavily populated, Grove City changed from a village to become a chartered city in 1958. The Board of Education of South-Western Local Schools took action on August 19, 1959, as outlined in law, to change the status of the school system and The South-Western City School System was established.

Many visible changes have taken place in the school district in the past 30 years, Schools were built and others were repaired and expanded to meet the demands of a fast-growing enrollment in the '60s and early '70s. That enrollment peaked in 1975 with 17,804 students.

A steady decline in the number of pupils in the last 11 years has reduced the enrollment to 16,000 students, and two schools have been closed. Even though the number of pupils has decreased, the district has climbed to 7th place in enrollment among Ohio's 615 school districts.

Since the early days of the district, South-Western City Schools has established a tradition of excellence in education. Long known as a leader in innovative education, its students and staff have earned numerous state and national awards.

To meet the demands of a technological age, computer mezzanines were built in the libraries at Westland High School and Grove City High School last year.




A new library-computer complex will be ready for Franklin Heights High School
